THE BANK OF JAMAICA ACT

Notice of Demonetization of Coins Pursuant to Section 16(1)

Pursuant to the Bank of Jamaica Act and in exercise of the power conferred upon Bank of Jamaica by Section 16(1) thereof the following notice is being issued:

- 1. The effective date of this notice shall be the 14th day of November 2017 ("the Effective Date").
- 2. Bank of Jamaica gives notice that, with effect from the expiry of three months' from the Effective Date, that is the 15th day of February 2018, One Cent, Ten Cents and Twenty-Five Cents coins shall cease to be legal tender.
- 3. Notwithstanding the above, Bank of Jamaica will continue indefinitely to redeem One Cent, Ten Cents and Twenty-Five Cents coins for face value.

BANK OF JAMAICA GUIDANCE ISSUED FURTHER TO NOTICE OF DEMONETIZATION OF COINS PURSUANT TO SECTION 16(1) OF THE BANK OF JAMAICA ACT

The following guidance shall be applicable in respect of the demonetization of the One Cent, Ten Cents and Twenty-Five Cents coins ("Specified Coins") pursuant to Notice issued by Bank of Jamaica effective 14 November 2017 and published in the Gazette:

- 1. The result of the demonetization is that, with effect from 15 February 2018, the Specified Coins will no longer be legal tender. These coins may however be redeemed indefinitely at the Bank of Jamaica or otherwise as may be advised.
- 2. The demonetization of the Specified Coins will only affect cash payments and will only apply to the total amount of the bill or transaction.
- 3. Cash transactions ending in 0.01 to 0.49 should be rounded down to the nearest dollar. For example, a transaction for \$40.49 should be rounded down to \$40.00.
- 4. Cash transactions ending in 0.50 to 0.99 should be rounded up to the next dollar. For example, a transaction for \$40.50 should be rounded up to \$41.00.

CHANGES FOR YOUR small CHANGE

COINS DEMONETIZATION

You cannot use 1, 10 or 25 cents coins after 15 February 2018.

Only cash transactions will be affected, not electronic or cheque

Where necessary, cash transactions should be rounded up or to the nearest dollar

When rounding up or down, only the total bill should be rounded, not individual items, unless you only buy one item.






Final Payment of \$80.00

After the demonetization of the one, ten and twenty-five cent coins on 15 February 2018, cash transactions ending in one to 49 cents should be rounded down to the nearest dollar, so an item cost or bill total of \$80.49 should be rounded down to \$80. At the other end, transactions ending in 50 to 99 cents should be rounded up to the nearest dollar. Therefore, an item cost or bill total that amounts to \$80.50 should then be rounded up to \$81. Non-cash transactions will be unaffected. These include cheques, credit and debit cards and wire transfers.
