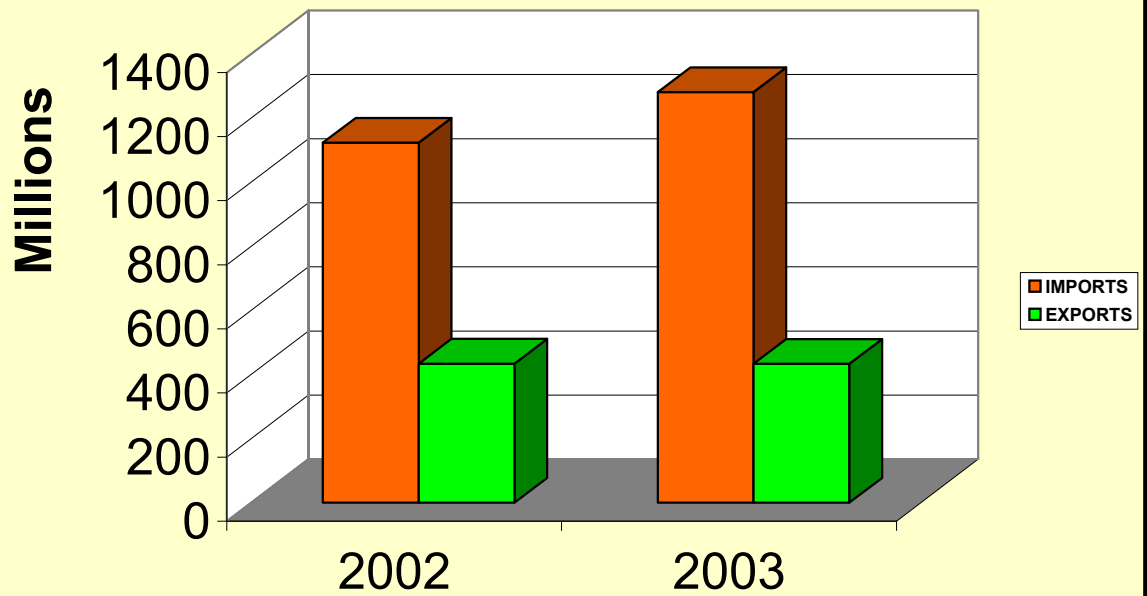

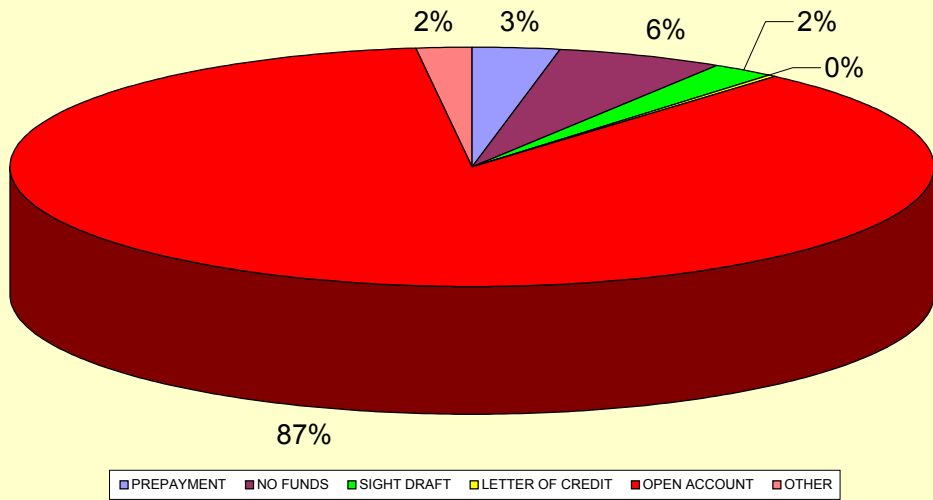

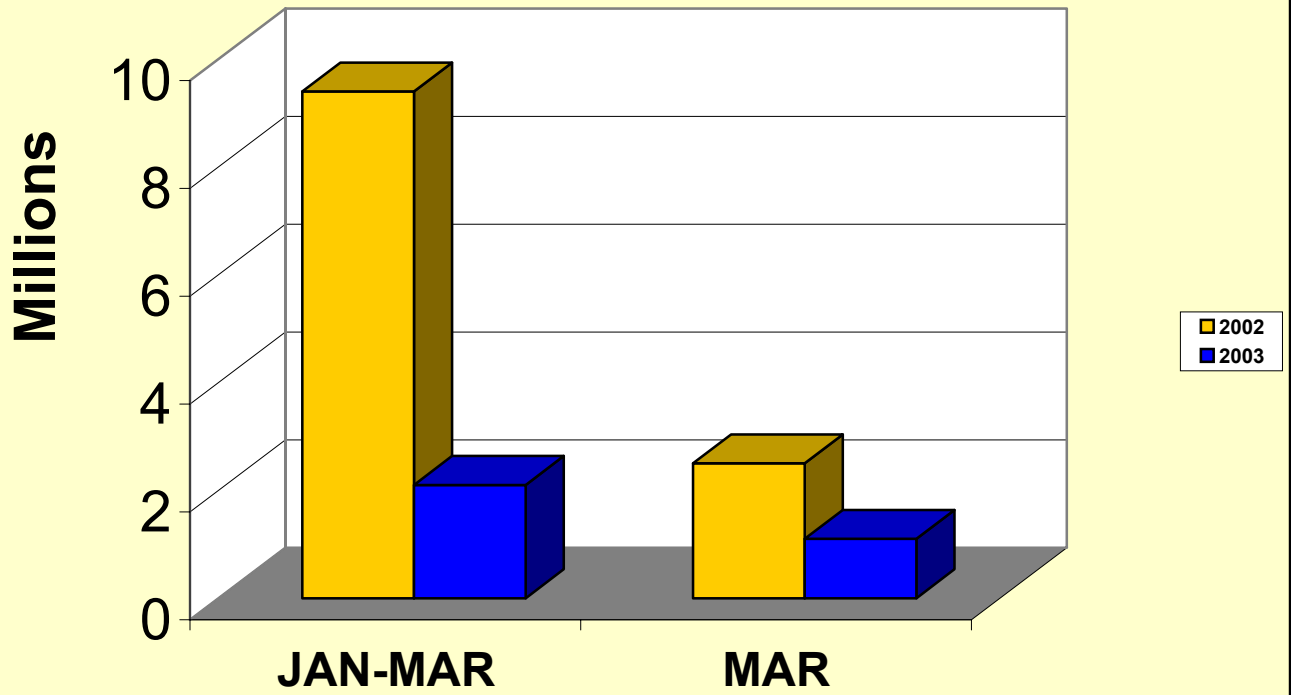

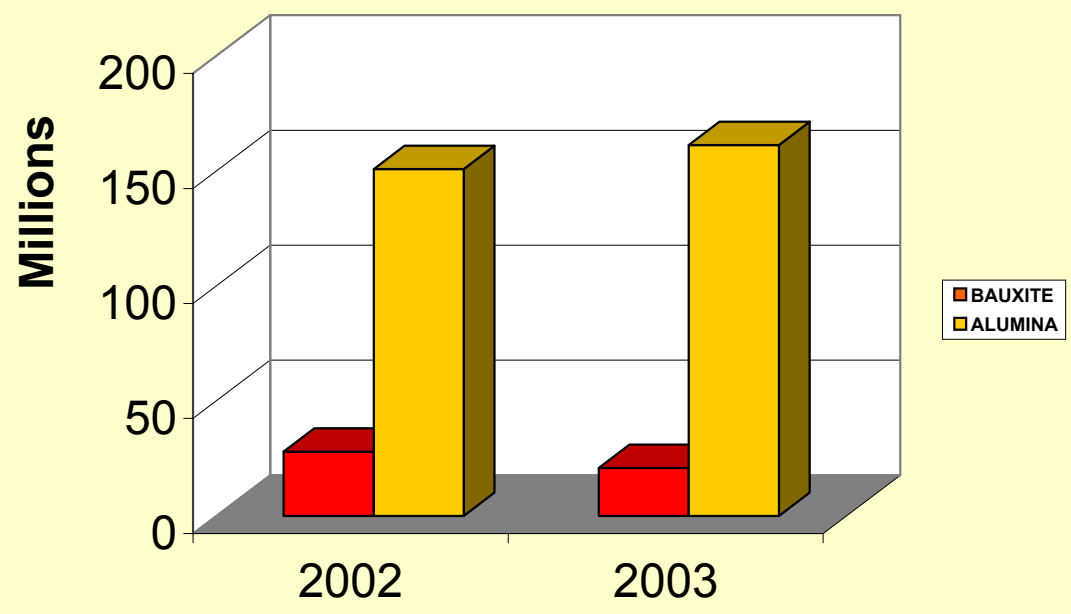

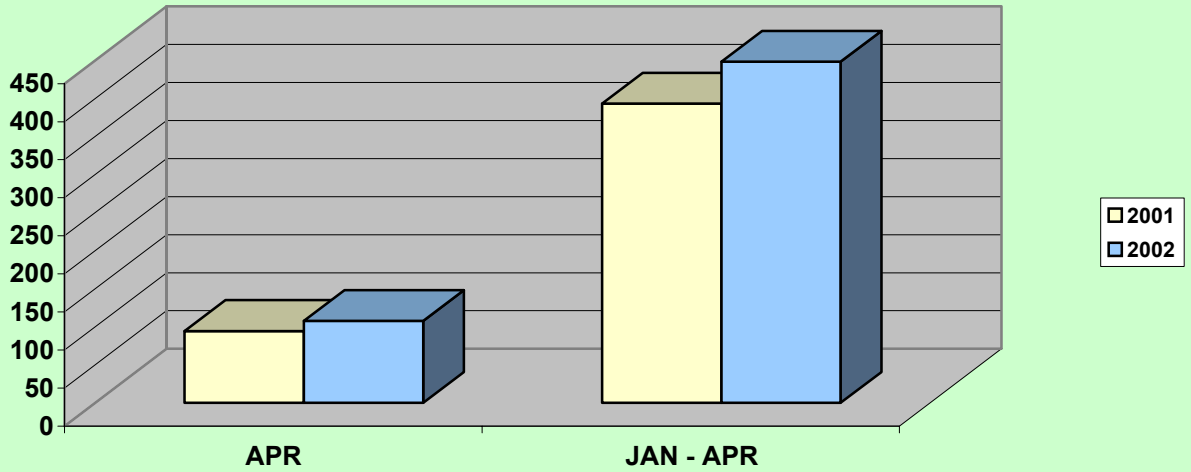

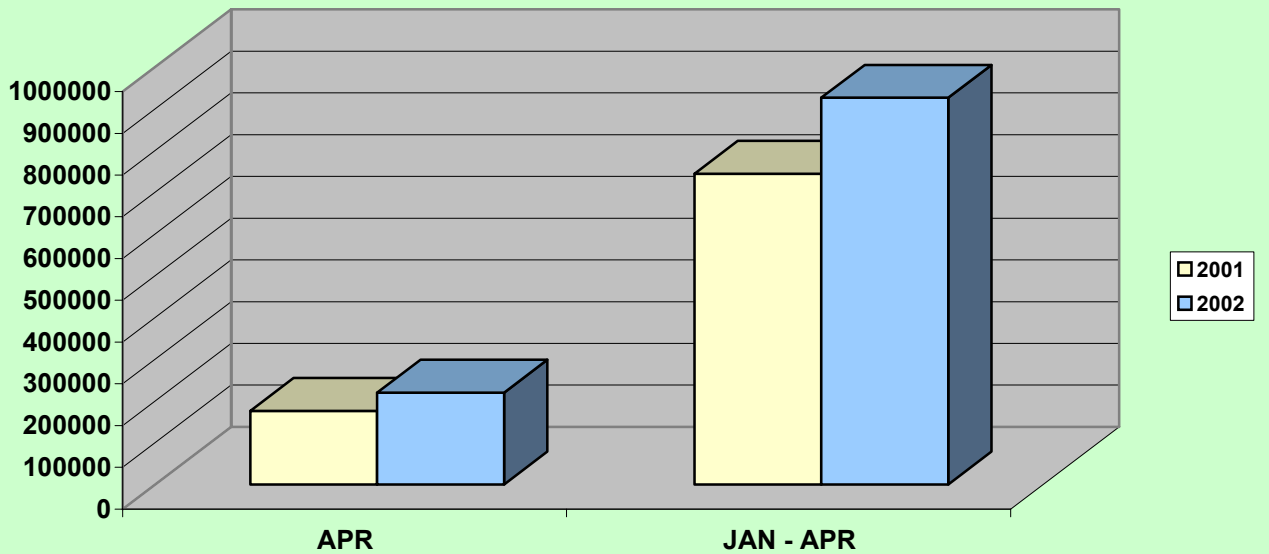

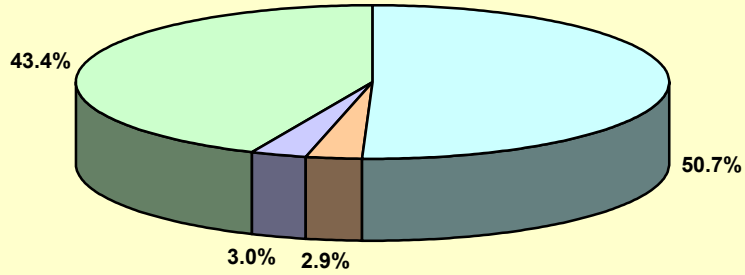
**Estimated Tourist Expenditure

**Jamaica: Total Visitors**

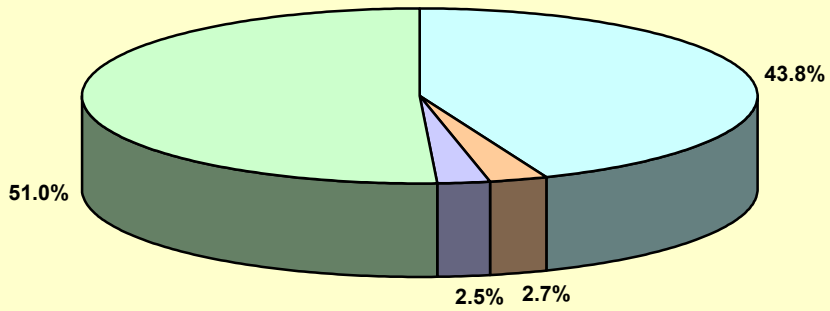


**Composition of Visitors

January - April 2003**



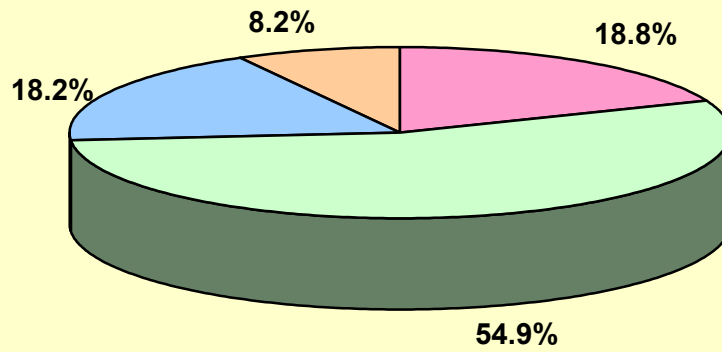

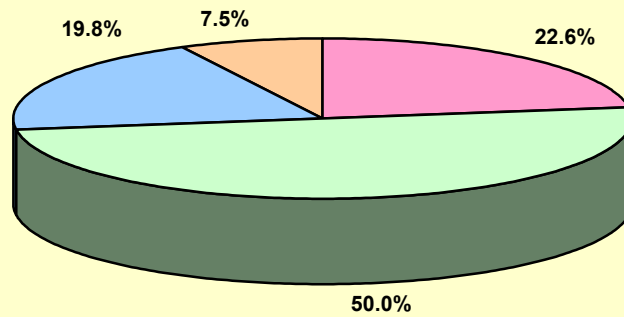
