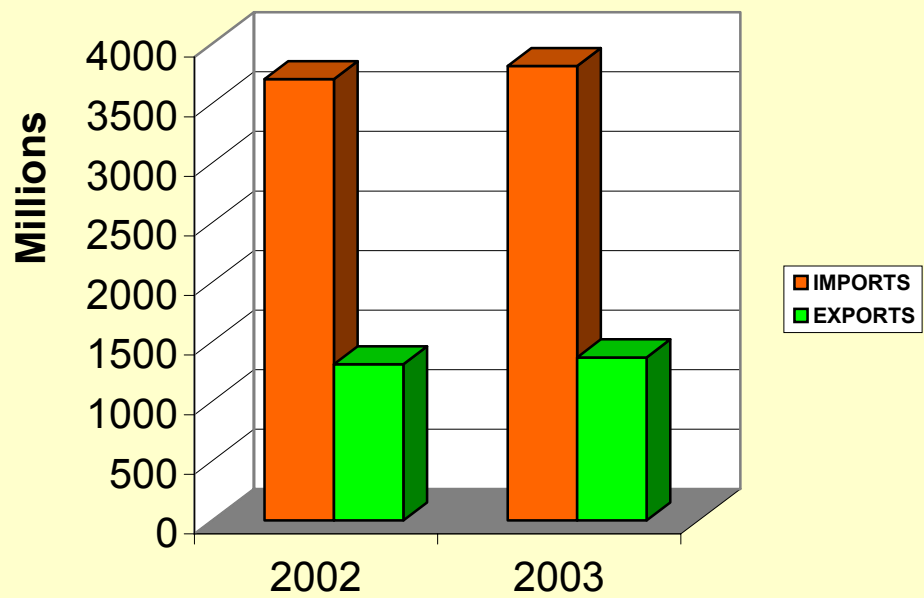
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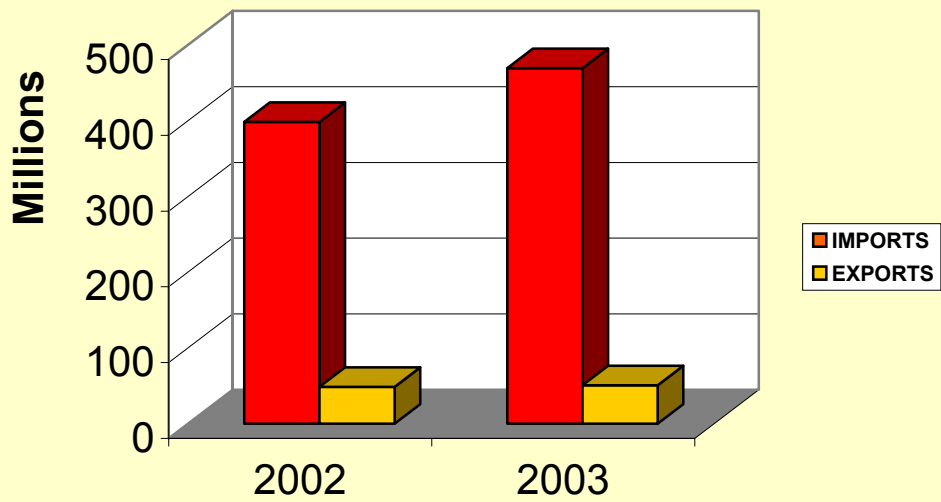

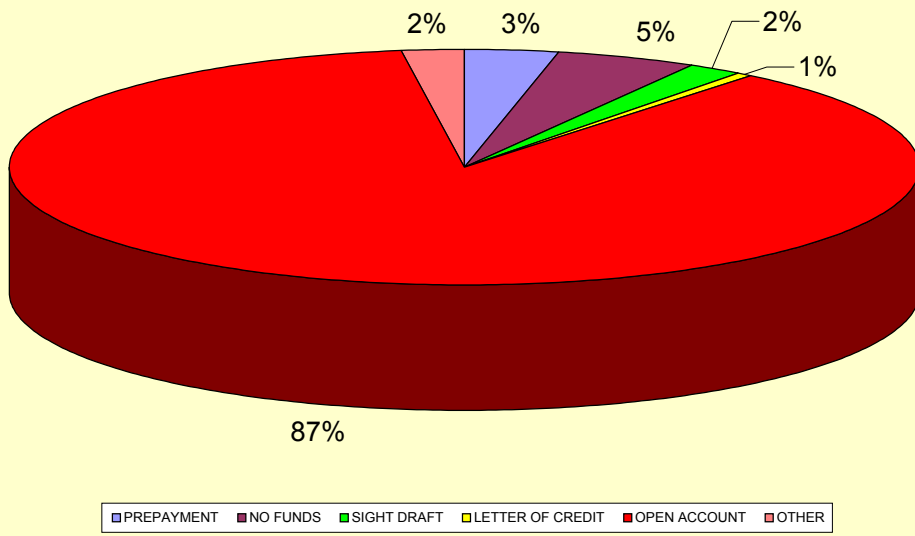

Jan - December 2003



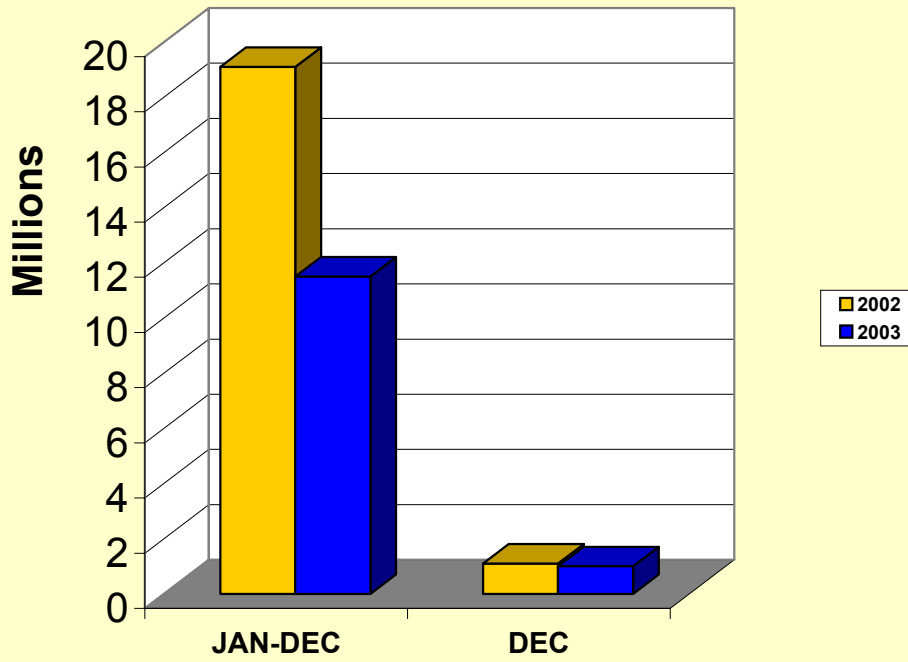

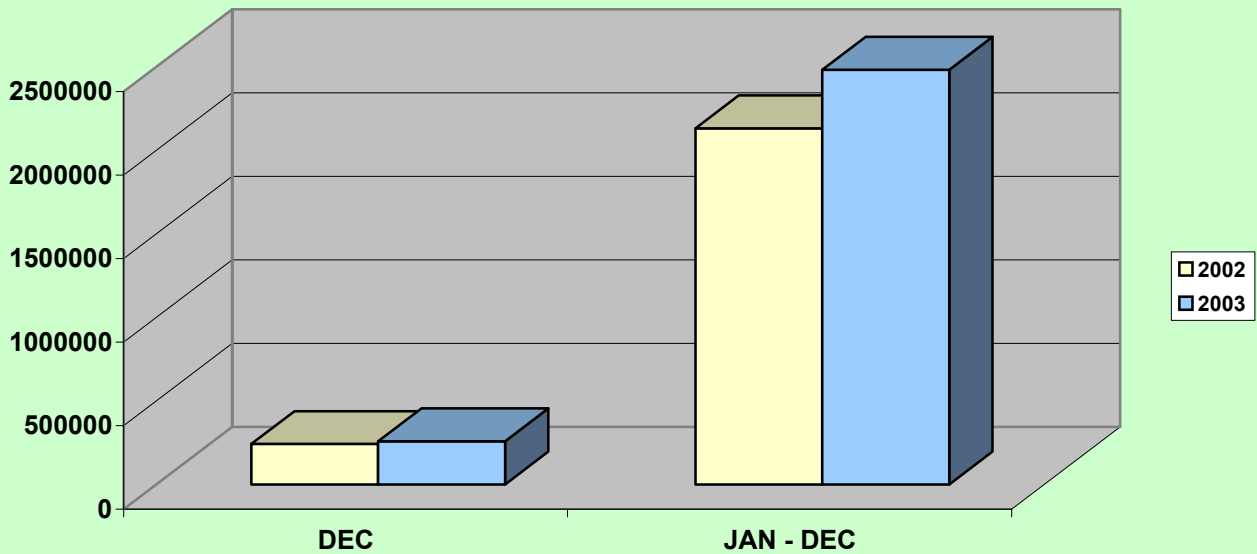

(US\$mn)**

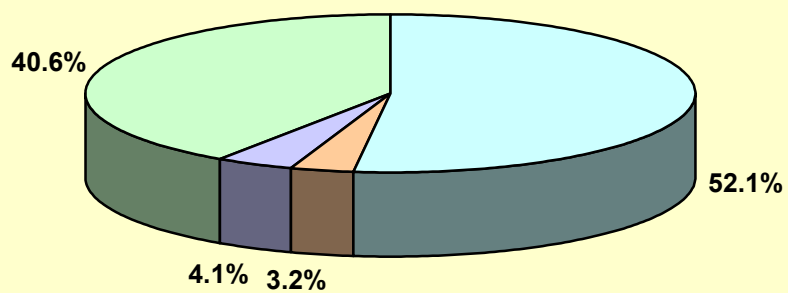


**Jamaica: Total Visitors**



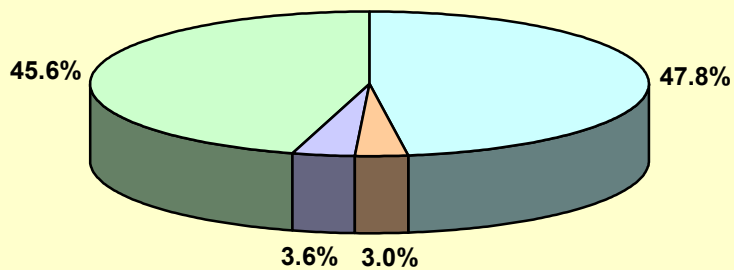


### Composition of Visitors January - December 2002

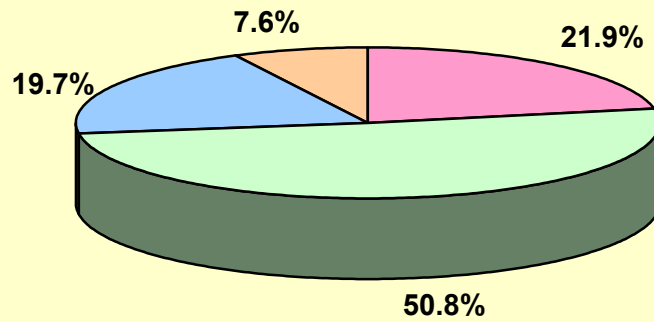

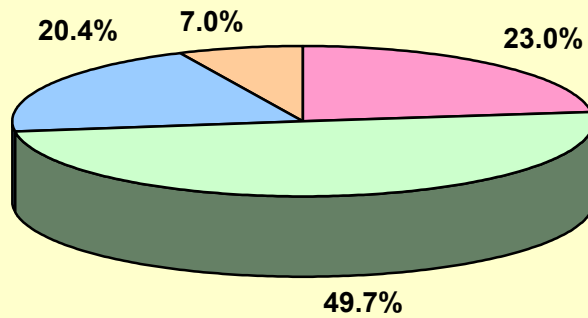
