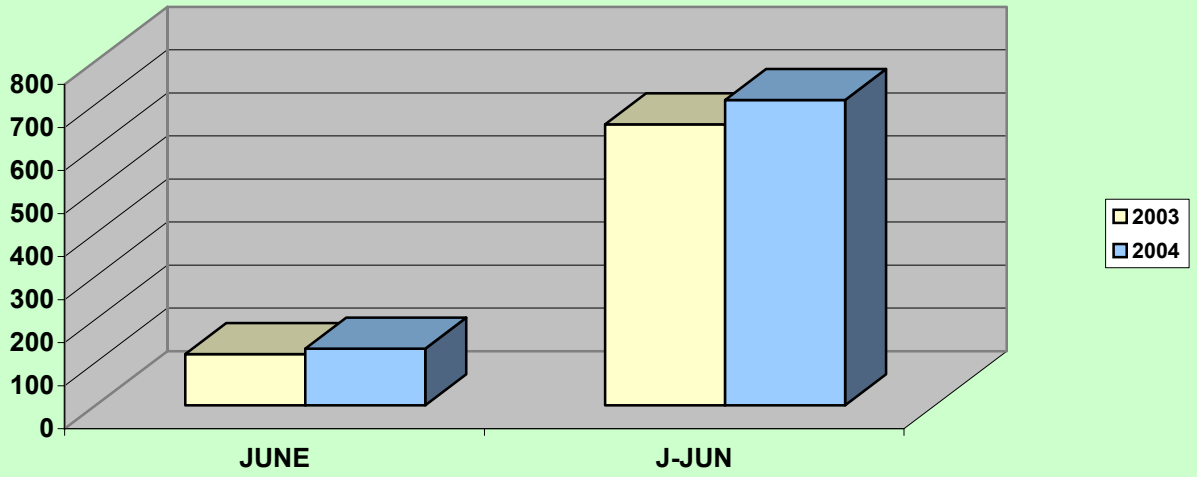

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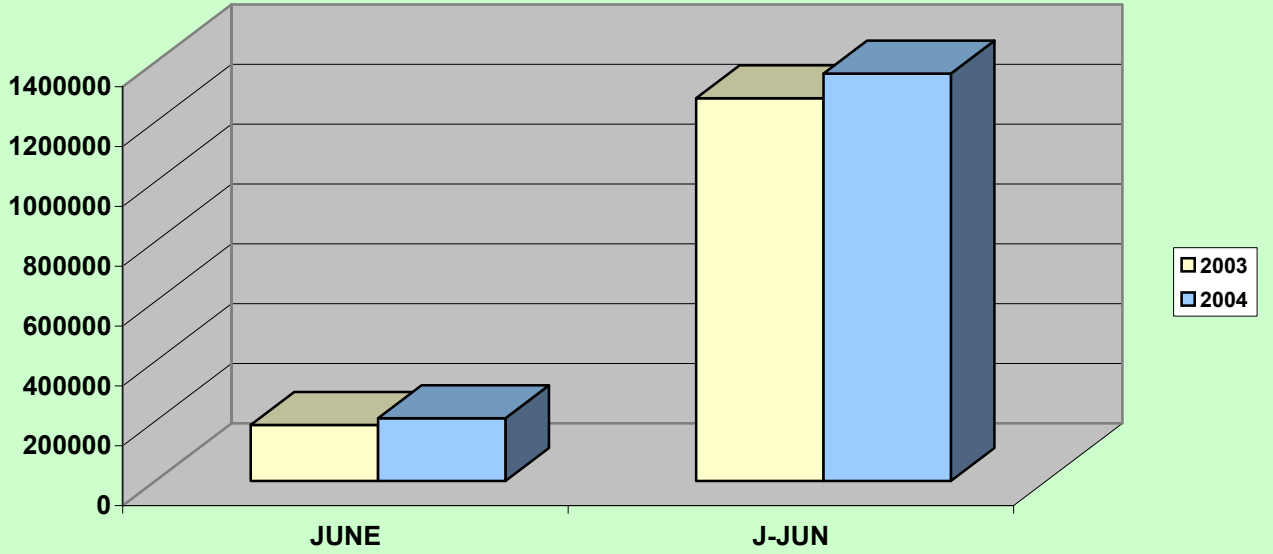

### Estimated Tourist Expenditure (US\$mn)

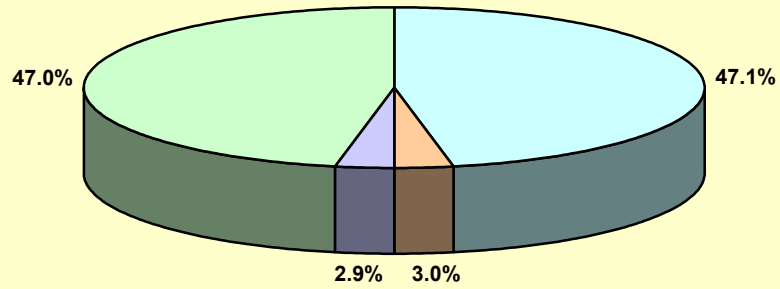


### Jamaica: Total Visitors



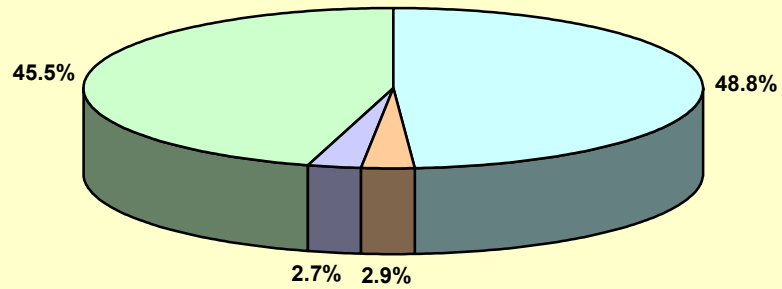


### Composition of Visitors January - June 2003

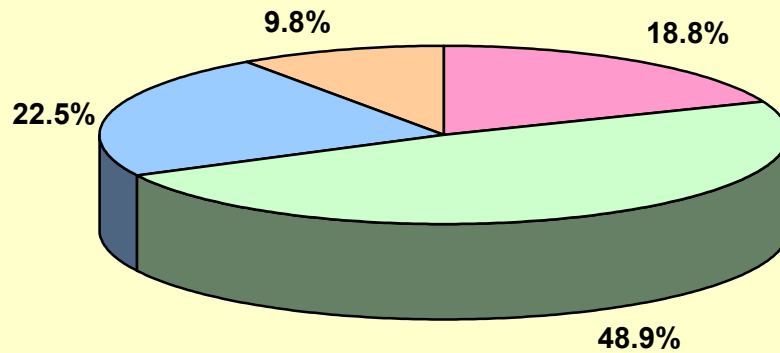

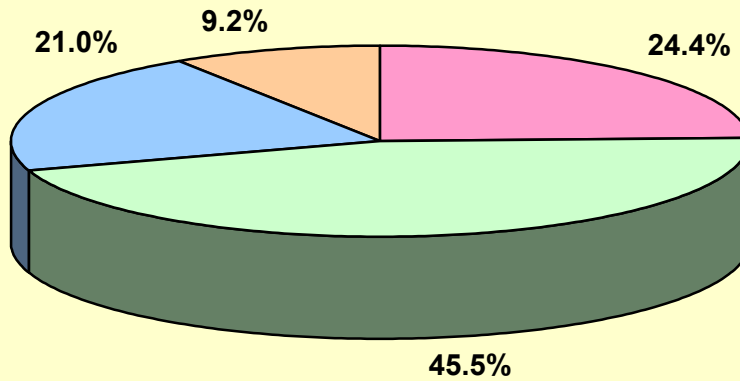
