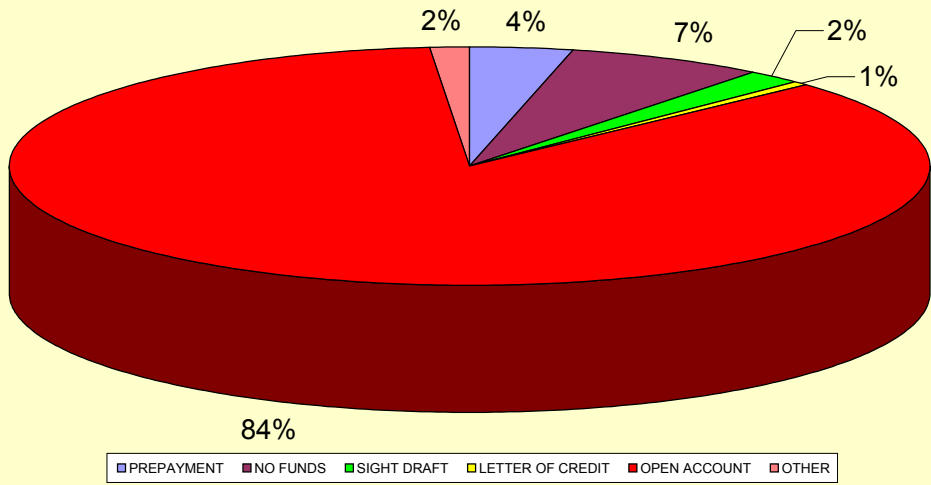

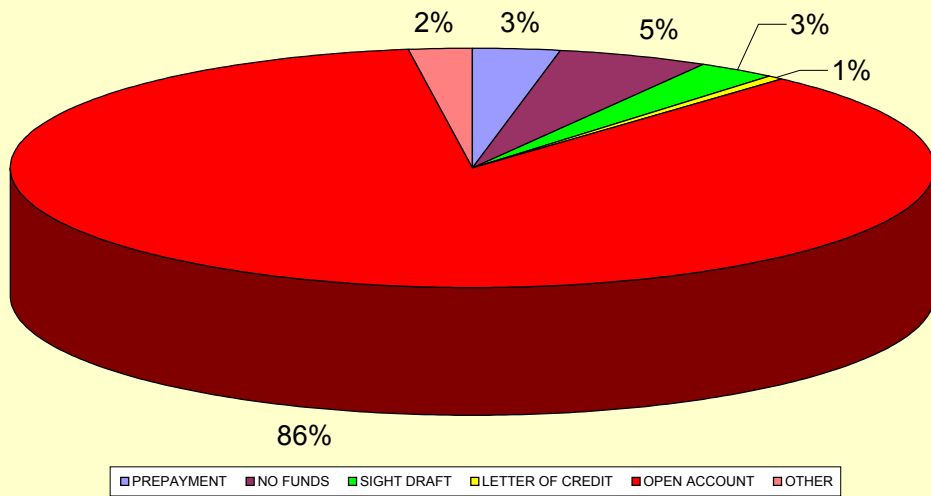

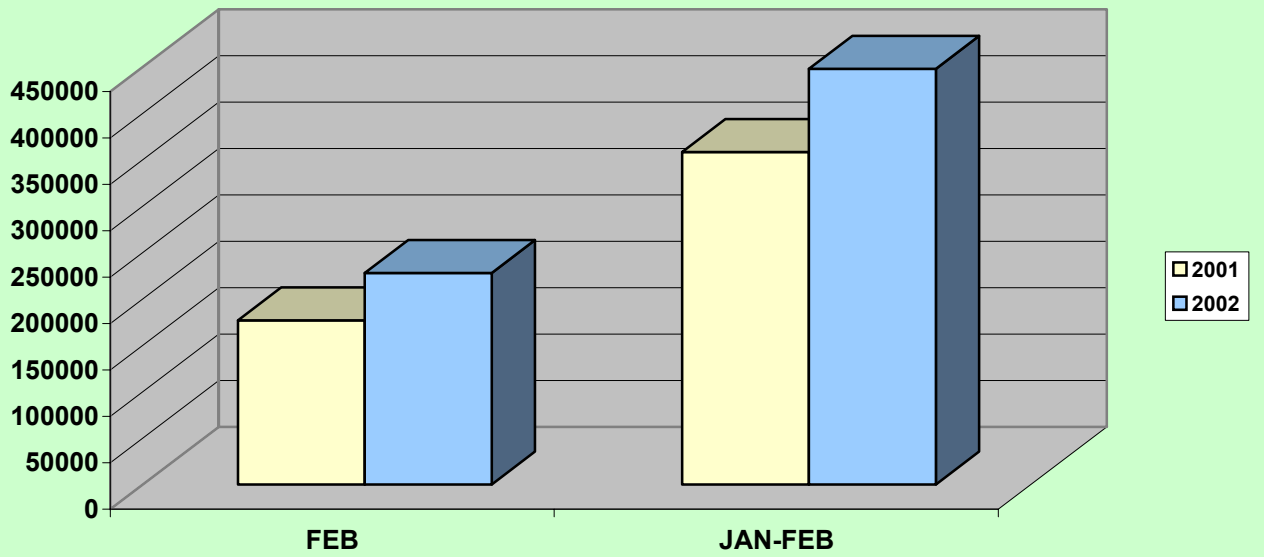

(US\$mn)**

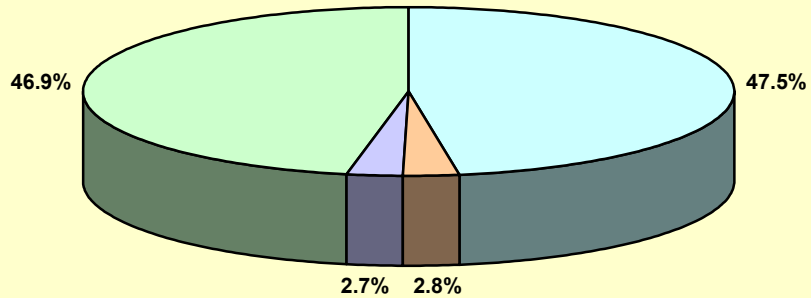


**Jamaica: Total Visitors**



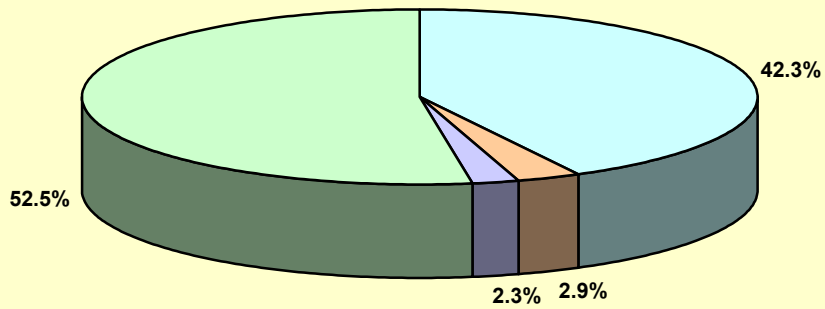


**Composition of Visitors

January - February 2003**



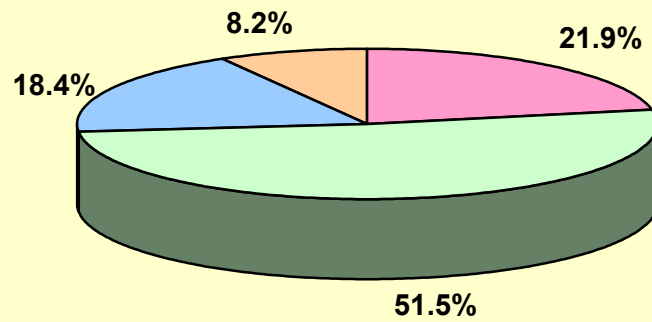

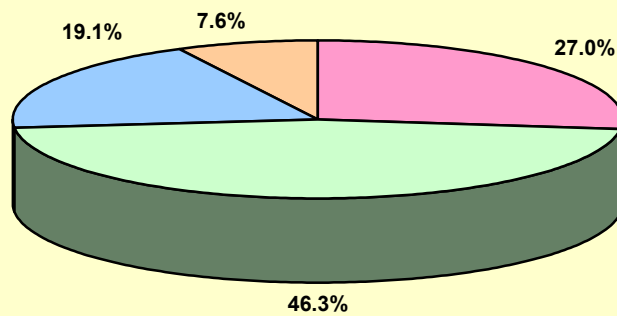
