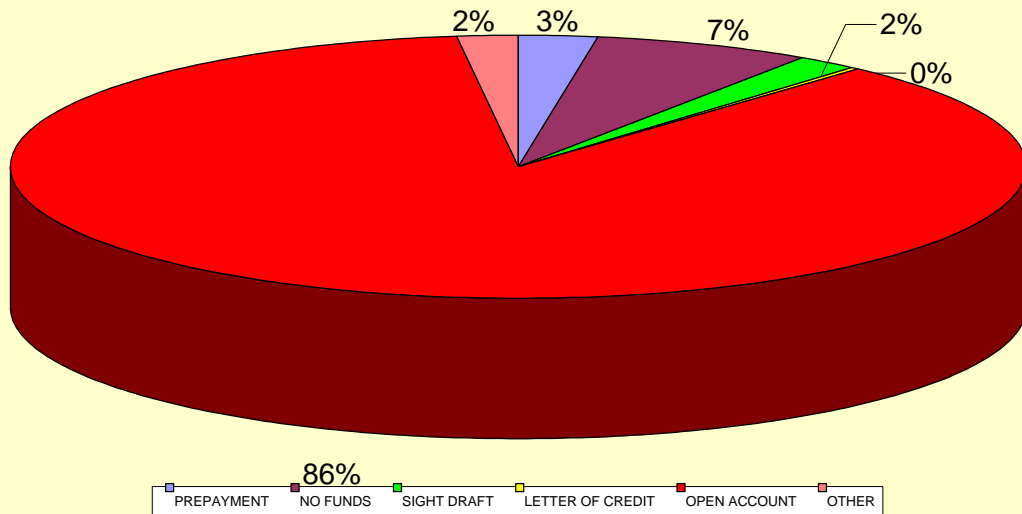

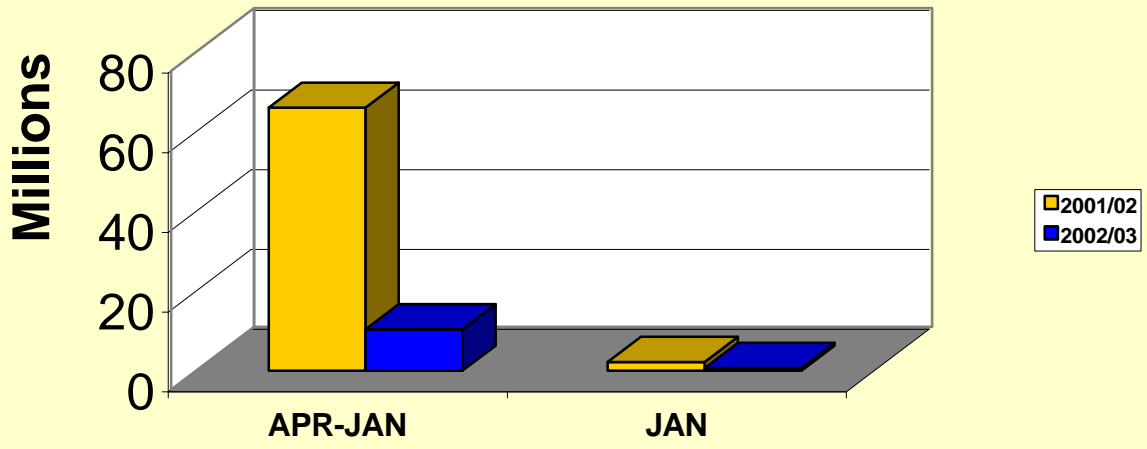

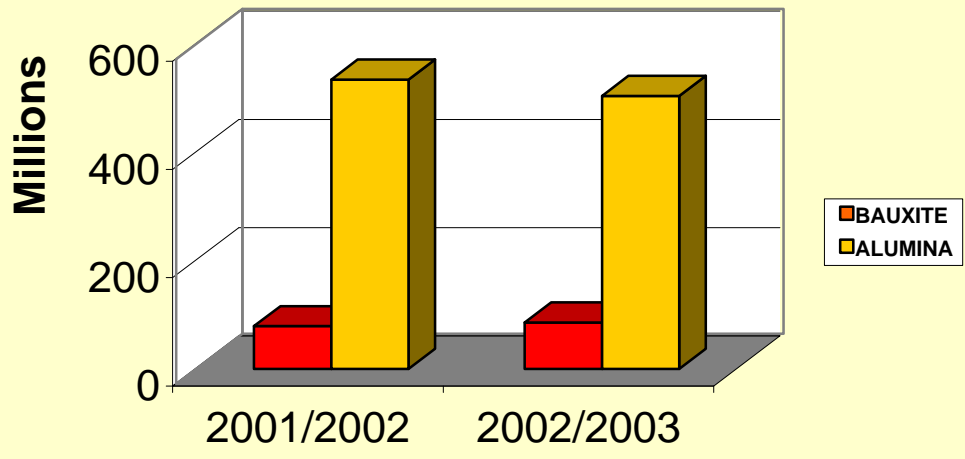

APR - JANUARY**



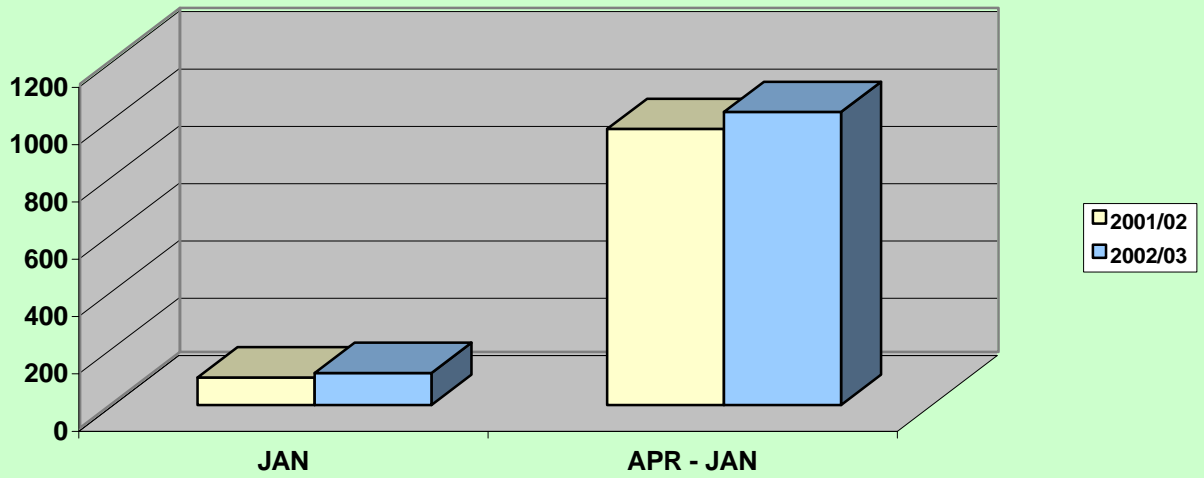

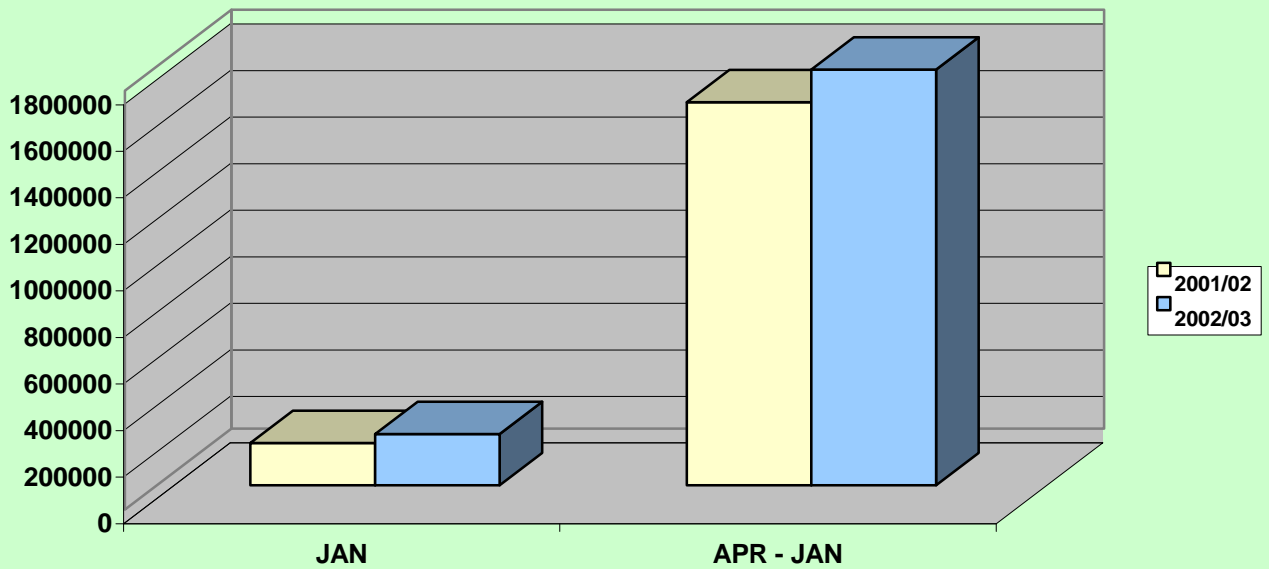

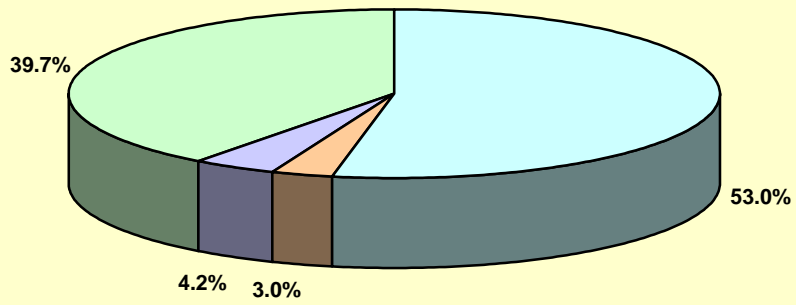
**Estimated Tourist Expenditure

**Jamaica: Total Visitors**

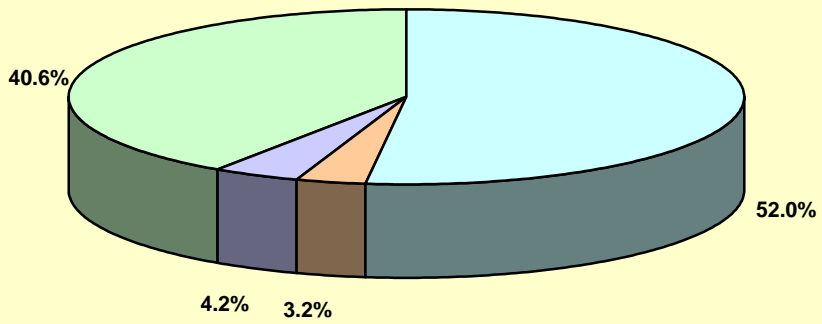


**Composition of Visitors

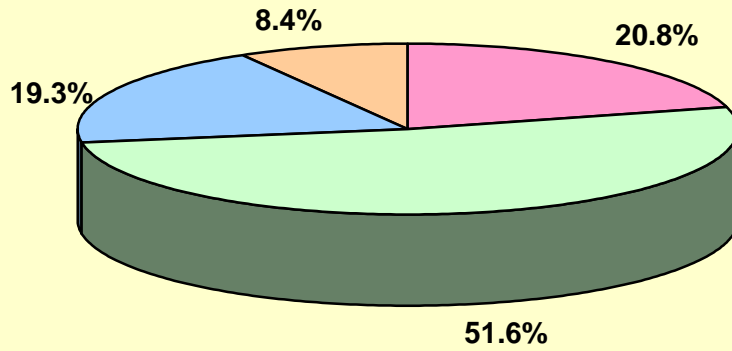

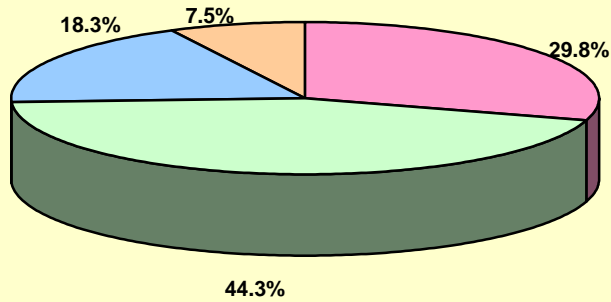
