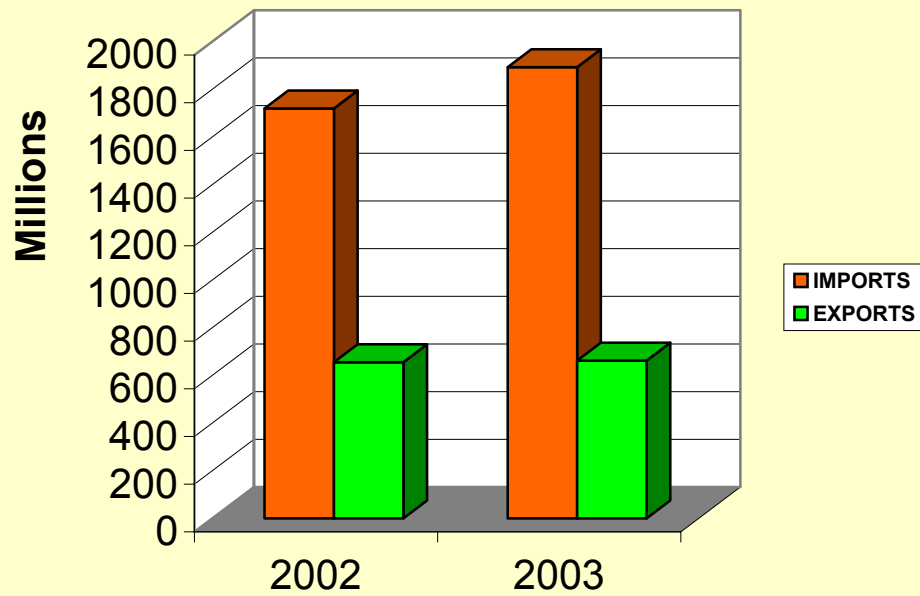

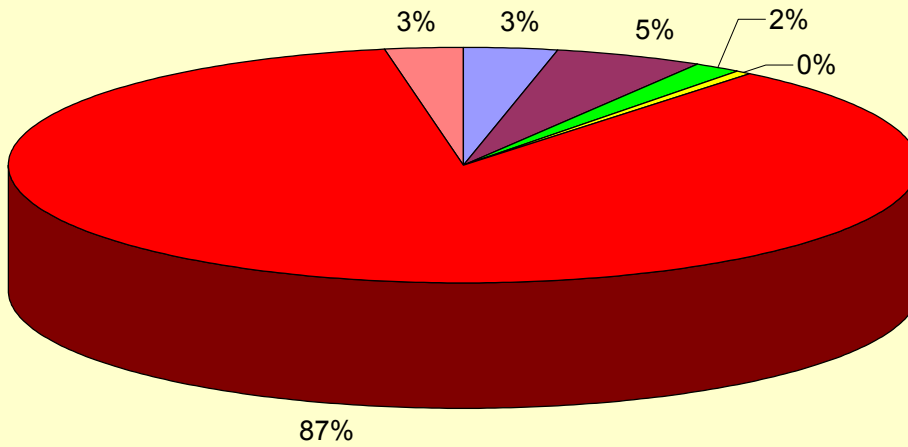

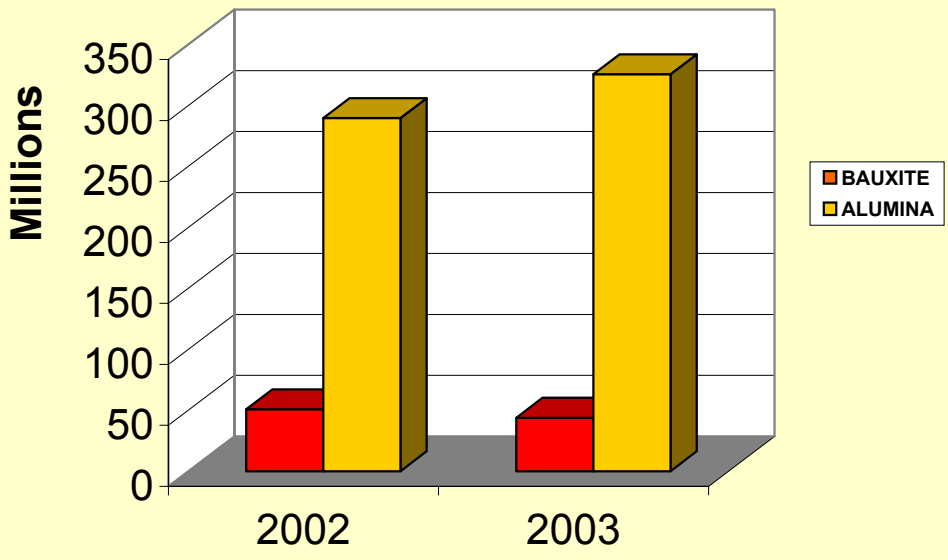

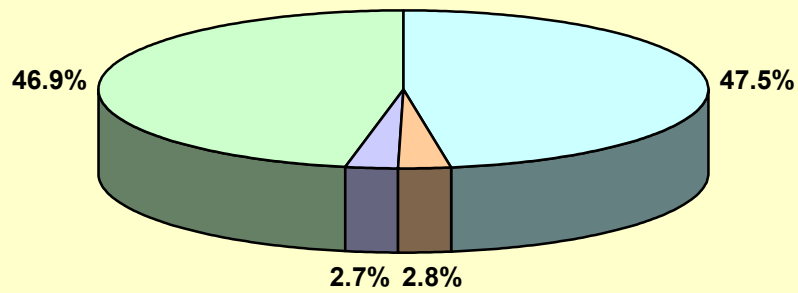

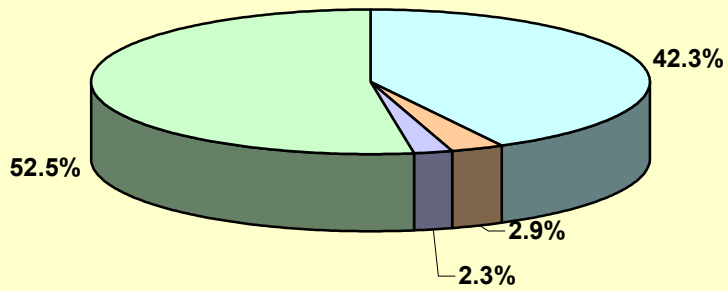


### Composition of Visitors January - July 2002

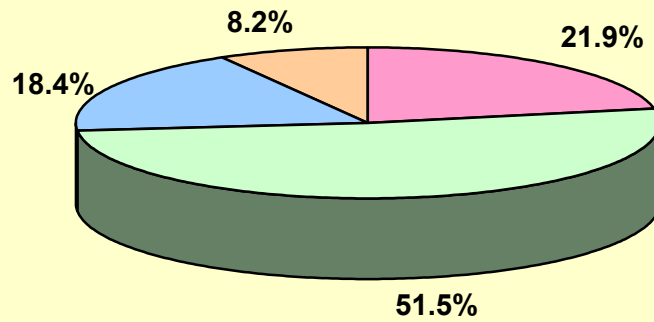

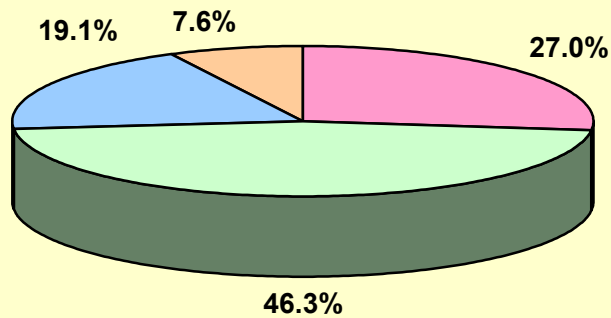
